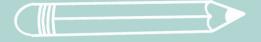
being a writer / artist / author is sexyyyyy, and that's a fact.

to you, and you want to "create meaning" out of the experience, and share what you learned, so that others can heal too.



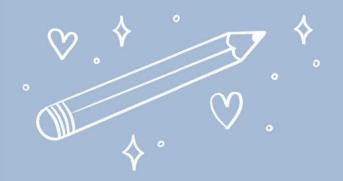
your kids and grandkids
